3 ASPECTS OF THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY-John Cossham

JC outlined the timeline covering the recognition of possible climate issues in 1824, followed by further data evaluation from 1896 onwards. It was not until 1965 that the greenhouse effect was noted as a problem. 2017 saw the recognition that ecological decline was now becoming evident, with an increasing number of species under threat, with many already extinct. 2018 saw the publication of a special IPCC(Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) report on the implication of increasing overall global temperatures, with a 1.5° c rise over baseline considered to be the maximum advisable. The need for resilience was evident, with a recognition that individual lifestyles, particularly material consumption patterns, would need to change radically. Local sourcing should be a priority, with a move away from the single use throwaway culture, with a sharp reduction in solar energy use where this requires rare earth mining for components. Farming methods which produce greenhouse gas emissions must be restricted, but this needs a change in demand. The effect of these proposals on third world economies could be severe. A drastic long term solution would be to reduce population growth. Are we running out of time for this to take effect? Probably yes.

Members thanked John for his thought-provoking exposition, no doubt to be updated in twelve months time.

(11)Micklegate Bar closure problems-to revise current comments.(12) problems over pedestrian/cycle solutions to the resignalling programme. No public consultation over proposals. (12)difficulties over Terry Avenue closure during flood defence works.

BO reported on progress on the long-distance Rufforth-Knapton bridleway route. involving complex discusions with CYC, Yorwaste, the Parish Councils, adjoining farmers, funding organisations and tree suppliers and contractors. BO is project managing this scheme on behalf of TREEMENDOUS. Completion expected early 2020, with continuing involvement in the restoration of the landfill site.
