AM was concerned that where communities wished to plant Christmas trees in particular they should be rooted, and not simply supplied cut. This would ensure that they would be a sustainable resource, and be planted at locations which would allow for significant growth, at least for the medium term. Cllr. Fisher quoted the Strensall experience, where a satisfactory solution had been found. Parish Councils should be allerted to this policy.

4 BIOCHAR-SAVING THE PLANET?- John Cossham, Adrian Lovett

The speakers outlined the environmental benefits of producing bio-char (aka charcoal) using waste timber in pyrolysis conditions in a low- or non-oxygen environment to improve soil without using unnecessary fertilisers. It can be used in composting or no-dig regimes, fixing the carbon in the ground. Any biomass can be used to produce the same results, with what might otherwise be regarded as a waste product. Various burning techniques were illustrated, including experimental examples producing electricity from the heat generated in a conventional power plant. "Charcrete", brickmaking, cattle feed, were some of the possible applications. Large-scale commercial production was problematic, as large quantities of feedstock would be required, although these were being trialled. There was now a considerable literature on the topic. Certainly the concept has credibility. Drax, watch out!

DM tabled a detailed report on the transport survey results, noting that the under-25 cohort were under-represented. 495 respondents were prepared to participate in a Citizens Transport Forum. CYC had still not responded to a request for funding support to canvas "hard to reach" groups. The Civic Trust had suggested establishing a "Transport Forum" to complement CYC consultations, to include a wide range of interested parties, such as businesses.

PC reported on the lack of progress on the "Northern Forest" initiative. Meanwhile the "Treemendous" tree-planting programme continues.

SR reported on the conclusion of the Moor Lane/Askham Bog enquiry, with a decision expected in mid.Feb. PC had attended on one day, and had not been impressed by the proceedings.

JT reported that there was to be a further One Planet group meeting to try and establish clear protocols for action and responsibility.

It had not been general practice for the YEF to comment on individual planning applications, but PC considered that this proposal was likely to have such an adverse environmental impact that the YEF should object, and he would submit an objection on behalf of the YEF. Members agreed.
